Possible Pilgrimages Update: Planning is progressing in regard to the Pilgrimage to Our Lady of Fatima at Bala. I have an outlined itinerary based at this time, on a maximum of 30 Pilgrims:

Our Lady of Fatima, Bala:

Depart Shrewsbury about 9.00am, either from Abbey Foregate or St Chad's. Arrive Bala about 10.30am. There are several tea rooms close to the Chapel for morning coffee. In the past we have been welcomed at the Chapel with a refreshing cuppa (donations accepted), but I've not confirmed this with Sr Patricia as yet.

11.00am. Quiet prayer at the Shrine, followed by Mass, which can be celebrated by our own priests, otherwise I will ask if the Parish Priest from Dollgellau is able to offer Mass for us; followed by Adoration.

1.00pm. Lunch, which can be purchased in local pubs, restaurants or cafes, followed by free time to wander to the lake or browse the shops on the high street. It may be possible to eat a packed lunch in the Parish Room or by the lake or river, a short walk away.

Depart Bala from 3.00pm depending on the weather.

I think the best departure point from Shrewsbury will be the bus stop outside the Abbey as it is directly opposite the car park.

I've not confirmed a date as yet as I'm still awaiting formal quotations from several coach companies, but it will probably be on a weekday in early September.
