## **Parish Notices**

**Shrewsbury Cathedral Parish Council – update:**

The Parish Council has been meeting every two months for the past year. The Council has been very helpful in acting as a deliberate line of communication between lay faithful and clergy in our Parish. In the past year, parishioners have been able to raise issues at the Council meeting via the members of the Council or through contacting the parish office. We are grateful to the members

of the Council who serve as a two way channel of communication between the laity and clergy where ideas can be tested and the best course of action discussed.

Recently the Council met to review the work of the past year and to discuss how it has contributed to the good of our Parish life and mission.

The Council has also been responsible for, or has helped with, various new initiatives. This work is in addition, and complimentary, to the many flourishing pastoral and spiritual initiatives that take place within our Parish. The main areas that have dominated the discussion and steady activity of the Council include:

Pastoral care - The setting up and development of a Bereavement Support Group which meets monthly in the Cathedral Parish room, has held a Bereavement Prayer Service, and offers care and assistance to those suffering from the loss of a loved one.

Evangelisation – In his apostolic exhortation ‘The Joy of the Gospel’, Pope Francis recalls that the Church is missionary by her very nature; she is not self-enclosed but sent out to every nation and people. The theme of sharing the good news of Jesus has been a theme of discussion.

Social events – The Council has discussed the importance of building community and we hope to consider holding social events.

Maintenance – Considerable progress has been made over the past twelve months with site maintenance of the churches, buildings, machinery and grounds. We also realise that some problems are difficult to resolve due to various factors of the age and structure of our property.

The members of the Council intend to continue to meet five or six times a year and updates will be given in the newsletter. There are now posters on our noticeboards that include information of who is on the Parish Council and how they can be contacted.
