Parish Notices and Other News

Bishop Mark to be resident in Shrewsbury - Over the past nine years Bishop Mark has increasingly been present in Shrewsbury with his stated desire for the Cathedral to be the living ecclesial centre and spiritual home of the Diocese. Bishop Mark is now coming to make his home with us from the beginning of April. It is almost four decades since a Bishop of Shrewsbury was resident in the town and we look forward to welcoming the Bishop's return. We will seek to support him in his task conscious that it involves much travel across the extensive geography of Shrewsbury Diocese.

The diocesan trustees have purchased number 13, Belmont by the sale and consolidation of three diocesan investment properties, including the house provided for Bishop Mark. The Bishop has asked that this property be used for the purposes of mission conscious of the growing activities at the Cathedral notably the success of the discernment project and most recently the newly

established diocesan office for catechesis. The basement will become the Bishop's office moved from Birkenhead from 1st April where his Personal Assistant, Mrs Theresa Stones can be contacted; it is envisaged that the ground floor space will be used for diocesan meetings and appointments; while the upper floors will be utilised for accommodation with Cathedral House now having reached capacity. We hope that the Bishop's presence will help build-up the continuing and growing mission of the Cathedral and also be a happy home for him.

Update on Deacon Fred Beddow - Over 25 years ago Deacon Fred was ordained as the first Deacon of the Shrewsbury Diocese and has ministered in the Cathedral Parish ever since. A year ago, Fred fell backwards down the stairs and broke his neck in several places. At the age of 93 he survived major spinal surgery. His consultant gave little hope that Fred would regain much function and movement below his neck and would be severally disabled for the rest of his life. However within weeks Fred was being pushed around in a wheelchair, learning to write again and overall making a nuisance of himself, determined to relearn and undertake ordinary tasks. Three months after his accident Fred was discharged home, able to stand and even swim. He set himself a goal that by Christmas 2018 he would be walking again. Fred reached this goal and gets stronger each week. Christmas saw him not only walking with his frame but able to walk from the car to the front of Our Lady of Pity Church. Since then he has continued to get stronger and more independent, picking up the threads of his life, writing, reading, computers, and involvement in the Church. On the first anniversary of his fall, we are pleased that Fred will be able to vest as a deacon and be present on the sanctuary at Our Lady of Pity for the Vigil Mass for Palm Sunday.
